6. Academic Reforms

- From the Academic Year 2024-25, subject specific Honours has been scrapped and General Honours in Law has been introduced in B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) and B.B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) programme.
- LL.M. course credit structure has been revised and keeping in line with global practice, Ten (10) point CGPA scale has been introduced.
- At undergraduate level also 10 Point CGPA Scale has been introduced.
- The university has stopped part-time Ph.D. programme and now offers only full-time time Ph.D. programme with the view of improving the quality of doctoral research by the scholars.
- From the A.Y. 2024-25, admissions to the Ph.D. programme are made on the basis of UGC NET/JRF qualifications and interview taken by the senior academicians.
- The University has collected very comprehensive feedback of students on the teaching, evaluation and overall performance of its faculty members for the winter semester of A.Y.

2023-2024 and Monsoon Semester of A.Y. 2024-25. The feedbacks were analysed and intimated to the concerned teachers.

- A comprehensive Multiple Intelligence Policy for taking care of the special needs of the advanced and slow learners has also been approved and implemented.
- Scheme of monthly progress report for LL.M. dissertation has been introduced to improve the overall quality of the research outputs of the postgraduate students.
- On the basis of feedback received from the students, the scheme of collaborative teaching has been discontinued.
- All class rooms have been converted into smart/digital classrooms equipped with all kinds of ICT tools with an objective to enrich teaching learning experience.

- Plagiarism testing of final draft of project has been made more stringent.
- Satisfactory progress has been made in matters of NAD-digilocker compliance and officials and staff of examination section have participated in a workshop organised by

department of Education, government of Bihar, for effective implementation of NAD-digilocker norms.

- To ensure organisation of free and fair examination even faculty members have been pressed into duty flying squads.

13. Health Centre

13.1 Health Centre of the University

- The Health Centres provide 24 hours generic medical facilities to all its students, faculties and staff members.
- Basic medicines are also provided to all its students, faculties and staff members.
- University has facility of providing oxygen & ambulance services also to its inmates for 24X7.
- One resident doctor and two para medical staff (one male and one female) are always available to meet the emergency health requirements of its inmates.

13.2 Health Centre established at the University by the Government of Bihar

- An Urban Primary Health Care Centre has been established by the Health Department, Government of Bihar to specifically address the health issues of University inmates.
- To meet this end, it provides primary healthcare services, including preventive, curative, and promotive care.

- It also provides essential lab test to aid diagnosis and treatment. A team of doctors (One male & One female), along with adequate number of para Medical staff have been deployed at the centre by the State Government.

13.3 Gymnasium

- To ensure overall fitness of faculty members, a separate gym facility has been created and faculty members have been encouraged to make optimum use of this facility.
- It is evident that prior to creation of this facility, the university has already provided this facility to the inmates of the boys and girls Hostel.

- Ms. Andrea M. Wojnar, UNFPA Representative, India & Country Director, Bhutan, inaugurates Gender Resource Centre (GRC) at Chanakya National Law University, Patna, in the presence of Prof. (Dr.) Faizan Mustafa (Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor, CNLU, Patna), Dr. Deepa Prasad (Chief of Programmes and Technical Support, UNFPA), Mr. Khwaja Saadat Noor (State head of office UNFPA, Bihar), and the UNFPA-GRC, CNLU team.
- The event, which marked the formalization of the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between CNLU, Patna, and UNFPA, is emblematic of an unwavering commitment to

advancing gender justice by creating networks and alliances for strategic cooperation with stakeholders and strengthening the implementation of laws and policies in Bihar.

- In the opening note for the event, Dr. Ayushi Dube (Postdoctoral Fellow at CNLU, Patna) noted that “the initiative is the beginning of a journey where we will work towards advancing shared mandates of gender justice through action-based research. We forge ahead with a renewed resolve to bridge the gap between knowledge and action by devising research strategies to address gender concerns in a participatory manner”. This was followed by a welcome address by Dr. Fr. Peter Ladis F.
- Discussing the significance of the UNFPA-CNLU partnership, Dr. Deepa Prasad highlighted that the newly-established GRC will work towards strengthening capacity-building programmes that address the prevention of gender-based violence and harmful practices through targeted training and stakeholder engagement; developing a resource pool of master trainers to support ongoing capacity-building in Bihar; launching special courses and undertaking empirical research in the domain of law and gender; and facilitating dissemination workshops and curriculum development”.
- In the keynote address, Miss Andrea M. Wojnar noted that deep-rooted gender inequality, religious myths, and gaps in policy implementation stand in the way of achieving gender justice. She highlighted the untapped potential for evidence-based public advocacy in Bihar and noted how by working with practitioners and community partners, we can create knowledge that can be used to bring change.
- Prof. Mustafa, in his presentational address, discussed the challenges in the domain of gender justice in general and gender property rights, reproductive health, and violence in particular. He underscored the need to critically evaluate the theoretical assumptions behind laws and the need to bridge the gap between theory and practice of law. He emphasized how students and academics are keen to take up courses such as corporate law, IPR law, and AI and law, but not in the much-needed gender and law courses. He added that the policymakers’ concern about gender equality is largely limited to the Uniform Civil Code debate.
- The event concluded with a vote of thanks by Dr. Chandan Kumar Sinha, Programme Coordinator of CRC, CNLU, Patna.

Circle Time

First Session:

The inaugural session centered on the Draft Digital Personal Data Protection Rules, 2025, with participants diving into the intricacies of data privacy, corporate responsibilities, and the impact of these proposed rules on individuals and businesses alike. The exchange of ideas and perspectives from students across 1st, 2nd and 3rd years, made this session both insightful and inspiring.

The session featured thought-provoking insights from our speakers—Shubham Sharma (4th year), Nikhil Dwivedi (3rd year) and Aditi Utkarsha (2nd year), whose perspectives added great depth to the discussion.

Second Session:

The second session was organized on the topic, “The Journey of Securities: From Private to Public Listing,” sparked vibrant discussions and thoughtful exchanges. Expertly led by Samiksha Kumari (4th Year), the session delved into critical aspects of IPOs, including why listing is essential, its advantages, potential threats, and the regulatory framework. Other engaging topics covered included:

- The role of seed funding and venture capitalists in driving companies toward public listing.
- Insights into the IPO procedure: from appointing merchant bankers to complying with SEBI’s regulations and RHP.
- The importance of transparent operations for investors and employees.
- Market benchmarks like Nifty and Sensex and their influence on investment psychology.
- Challenges such as price manipulation, regulatory failures, and unfair market practices.

The discussions offered attendees a chance to enhance their understanding of capital markets and corporate transparency.

Third Session:

The third session of Circle Time, organized by CARCIL, was held on 24th January, 2025, featuring Ms. Arya Gupta (4th year) as the speaker. Fourth Session:

The session, titled "Banking & Finance: Essential Recovery Tools," was aimed at providing an insightful overview of the complex legal landscape surrounding asset recovery, both at the domestic and international levels.

The session was led by Mr. Purushottam Kumar, a distinguished 2013 CNLU alumnus, who currently serves as a resource person at the Bihar Judicial Academy and BIPARD. With his extensive expertise in banking and finance, Mr. Kumar elaborated on the diverse legal avenues available for asset recovery, highlighting their dependency on national laws, foreign regulations, and international agreements such as conventions and treaties.

A key focus of the discussion was the fragmented nature of asset recovery frameworks across multiple legal sources, particularly in transnational cases. The session provided a comprehensive understanding of the legal considerations and challenges involved in recovering assets across borders, along with the essential legal tools that practitioners must be aware of.

Fifth Session:

The fifth session of circle time was organized on the topic 'Introduction to M&A'. The session featured thought-provoking insights from our speaker — Satyanshu Kumari (4th year). The session provided a brief overview of the complex legal landscape surrounding mergers and acquisitions in India. The topics covered were:

Mr. Jain emphasized the importance of corporate and commercial law, focusing on contract law as the foundation of commercial practice. He advised students to prioritize academics while balancing internships, debunking the myth that college rankings determine success, and stressing individual capabilities as key.


Highlights Of The Academic Year 2024-25

Visit To Kendriya Vidyalaya, Patna

Objective:

To commemorate the Birth Anniversary of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar, CNLU Legal Aid Cell organized a legal awareness camp at Kendriya Vidyalaya, Kankarbagh, Patna.

On 15th April, 2024, the student members of CNLU Legal Aid Cell engaged in a discussion with the students of Kendriya Vidyalaya, Kankarbagh, Patna, exploring the fundamental rights enshrined under Part III of the Indian Constitution such as right to equality, right to life and personal liberty, fundamental freedoms, right to education, right against exploitation, religious freedom and right to constitutional remedies. They also explored the contemporary issues like gender equality, human rights violations, human trafficking which are often overlooked in the textbooks. The session further delved into the intricacies of pursuing a career in law, skills and educational qualifications required to become an advocate, sparking great interest among the school students.

The legal awareness camp at Kendriya Vidyalaya, Kankarbagh, empowered students with knowledge of fundamental rights and contemporary social issues. By addressing topics like gender equality, human trafficking, and human rights violations, the session broadened their understanding beyond textbooks. 1st Year Orientation

"Empowering University House Help: Rights and Welfare Awareness"

National Lok Adalat at Patna Civil Court

Objective:

We are proud to share that the 3rd National Lok Adalat of this year was successfully conducted on 14th September at the Patna Civil Court, with 18 benches constituted to resolve various legal disputes. Among the panel were students from our Legal Aid Cell, who had the unique opportunity to serve as empaneled judges, actively participating in negotiations and witnessing justice in action.

This experience made possible under the able guidance of our Faculty Coordinator, Dr Fr Peter Ladis Francis., gave students firsthand exposure to cases involving the Motor Vehicle Act, Negotiable Instruments Act, labor disputes, and matrimonial matters.

A notable moment from this Lok Adalat was the inclusion of Reshma Prasad, a prominent transgender social worker, who made history as a member of one of the 18 benches. Her participation emphasized the growing inclusivity within our legal processes.

Outcome:

The 3rd National Lok Adalat provided CNLU Legal Aid Cell students with invaluable hands-on experience in resolving real-life legal disputes. Serving as empaneled judges, students actively participated in negotiations and witnessed the practical application of law across diverse cases, including motor vehicle, labor, and matrimonial disputes. This exposure deepened their understanding of alternative dispute resolution methods, particularly the significance of Lok Adalats in promoting justice. Additionally, interacting with legal professionals, including the District Legal Aid Authorities, enhanced students' awareness of their role in fostering legal awareness and inclusivity, enriching their academic and practical legal knowledge.

Celebrating Constitution Day

Report on Legal Awareness Camp at St Mary's Academy, Patna, 2025

The legal awareness camp was conducted on 17th January, 2025 at St. Mary's Academy, Patna. The camp took place to educate about students about the rights of an arrested person, the procedure of filing an FIR, the rights of arrested women, and career opportunities in law.

The camp also provided insights into law as a career, covering fields such as CLAT preparation, judiciary, litigation, academia, and corporate law. This report provides an overview of the camp, including the sessions conducted and the topics covered.

Objectives:

1. To create awareness about the rights of an arrested person under Indian law.
2. To educate participants on the procedure and significance of filing an FIR.
3. To discuss the special legal provisions available for arrested women.
4. To provide guidance on law as a career, covering CLAT and other legal professions.

1. Legal Awareness Through Skit:

➤ **Moot Court Committee**

Report of Fresher's Intra Moot Court Competition 2024-25

The Freshers Intra Moot Court Competition, 2024-25 was successfully conducted on 3rd October 2024. The competition saw the participation of 37 teams comprising 116 participants from the first-year batch. The event was designed to introduce freshers to the art of mooting and provide them with an experiential learning opportunity in a simulated courtroom environment.

To ensure the smooth conduct of the event, second-year members of the Moot Court Committee (MCC) played a crucial role as courtroom masters and timers, ensuring that the rounds proceeded in an organized manner. The senior-most students of the university, i.e., the fifth-year students were entrusted with the responsibility of serving as judges, evaluating the participants based on their oral pleadings, memorials submitted, ability to answer questions and overall courtroom mannerisms. Additionally, 22 second- and third-year students acted as mentors for the teams, guiding them through the competition and helping them refine their arguments. The MCC also organised a special Manupatra Training Session for the participants on 27th September 2024 to provide them a hands-on experience with legal research tools, aiding participants in preparing for the competition.
