Concept Note

India is the founder member of WTO and signatory to the TRIPS agreement as well. But until 2016, it had no IPR policy of its own. On 12th May, 2016, the Central government drafted and launched the 'National IPR Policy' to establish an IP ecosystem in the country which should be conducive to innovation and creativity. It was realised that the commercialisation of intellectual creation is possible only when there is mass awareness in this domain. The IPR policy seeks to restructure the IP framework and create awareness about economic, social and cultural benefits of IPRs among all sections of the society, to stimulate IPR generation and commercialization, modernize and strengthen IPR administration-the enforcement and adjudication. It drafted seven-point policy programs, i.e. 1. IPR Awareness; 2. Generation of IPRs; 3. Legal and Legislative Framework; 4. Administration and Management; 5. Commercialization of IPR; 6. Enforcement and Adjudication; 7. Human Capital Development. The objectives of the policy were well defined to create the vibrant IP ecosystem for the enhancement of innovation, creativity, industrial development for employment and economic progress. The Government connected research and development organisations, educational institutions, corporations, MSMEs, start-ups and other stakeholders in the creation of an innovation-conducive ambience. The establishment of IPR CHAIRS, research centres, various incentive programs, filing of patents, trademarks, GI applications, were initiated and encouraged. Of course, the efforts of DPIIT along with Chairs and centres have been stimulating vibrations in the IP ecosystems, from the last ten years. Therefore, it's a right time to assess the "working of National Intellectual Property Rights Policy, 2016", in its sum and substance, and learn a lesson for further strategies in this domain.
